Your task

The ICRC delegate has several functions: visiting prisoners of war and political detainees, restoring family ties, organizing relief operations and promoting the principles of the Red Cross and of international humanitarian law. As a representative of the ICRC, he/she also maintains contact and negotiates with government authorities – civilian and military – in order to carry out his/her works as effectively as possible.

Selection requirements

- ideal age: 25 to 35
- **prepared to accept unaccompanied postings for the first two missions (minimum 12 months each)**
- excellent command of Arabic, English. French an asset
- university degree or equivalent
- minimum two years of professional experience a must
- driving licence (for manual transmission vehicles)
- fully conversant with IT tools

- strongly motivated by humanitarian work
- open-minded and adaptable
- responsible and well-organized
- neat appearance, good speaker, well-developed writing and summarizing skills
- excellent ability to work in a team and under pressure in a potentially dangerous environment
